



West Virginia's Promise AmeriCorps VISTA Project

The West Virginia Department of Education and the Arts supports West Virginia's Promise-The Alliance for Youth. West Virginia's Promise is a statewide organization supporting the Five Promise's of the national organization America's Promise; Caring Adults, Safe Places, Healthy Start, An Effective Education and Opportunities of Help Others.

The America's Promise Alliance grew out of the Presidents' Summit for America's Future in 1997, at the gathering in Philadelphia, Presidents Clinton, Bush, Carter and Ford (with Nancy Reagan representing President Reagan), challenged America to make children and youth a national priority.

West Virginia's Promise Statewide Director, Pamela Dugan is the Project Manager of the AmeriCorps VISTA Project.

AmeriCorps*VISTA is a national service program that addresses the problems of poverty by providing people of diverse backgrounds and ages with an opportunity for full-time community service. VISTAs serve for a year term, addressing the needs of disadvantaged communities by developing permanent infrastructure for organizations and securing resources for human and civic development.

VISTA members serve to coordinate and develop new and existing programs to improve the lives of children and youth in West Virginia. The members identify stakeholders; bring groups together to form partnerships and secure grant funding for youth serving programs.

In our first year, 5 AmeriCorps VISTA members within the West Virginia's Promise project have generated the following resources for their communities:

- Number of new volunteers recruited: 294
- Total hours of service performed by community volunteers: 2,143
- Dollar value of cash resources: \$13,100
- Dollar value of non-cash resources: \$27,091
